### Why are all our Crosses and Saints covered in purple drapery?

Last Sunday was the beginning of "Passiontide", the two weeks between "Passion Sunday," and "Easter Sunday."

**We lose things during Lent. We are being "pruned" through the liturgy.** Holy Church experiences liturgical death before the feast of the Resurrection. The Alleluia goes away on "Septuagesima," (the first of the seven Sundays before Easter). Music and flowers go on Ash Wednesday.

**Last Sunday, being the Fifth Sunday of Lent, our statues and images were draped in purple.**

Traditionally, Crosses may be covered until the end of the celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday and images, such as statues may be covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil. (Those veils may be removed during the singing of the Gloria.)

The **pruning** cuts more deeply as we march into the Triduum. After the Mass on Holy Thursday the Blessed Sacrament is removed from the main altar, which itself is stripped and bells are replaced with wooden noise makers.

+ On Good Friday there *isn't even a Mass*. At the beginning of the Vigil we are deprived of light itself! It is as if the Church herself were completely dead with the Lord in His tomb.

+ **This liturgical death of the Church** reveals how Christ emptied Himself of His glory in order to save us from our sins and to teach us who we are.

+ The Church then gloriously springs to life again at the Vigil of Easter.

If we can connect ourselves in heart and mind with the Church's liturgy in which these sacred mysteries are *re-presented*, then by our active receptivity we become participants in the saving mysteries of Christ's life, death and resurrection. To begin this active receptivity we must be baptized members of the Church and be in the state of grace. — **by Fr. John Zuhlsdorf**

### April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month

It is a time to acknowledge the importance of families and communities working together to prevent child abuse. There are approximately 1.2 million children trafficked every year. The United States is considered one of the top destination points for child trafficking and child slavery victims. Anyone can be trafficked. Children are forced to work in the agriculture business, traveling sales crews, restaurants, hotels and in the commercial sex industry. Some of these are easy to see — but most are hidden.

What does Catholic Social teaching say?

Scripture teaches that God has a special concern for the poor and vulnerable. The church calls on all of us to put the needs of the poor and vulnerable first. This preferential option for the poor and vulnerable should be reflected in both our daily lives and public policies. A fundamental measure of our society is how we care for and stand with our poor and vulnerable brothers and sisters.
