Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

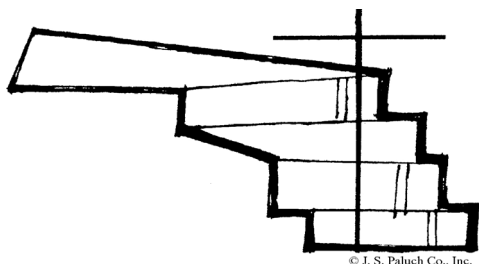

In today's Gospel reading we hear part of Jesus' discourse at the Last Supper as reported in the Gospel of John. "I am the way and the truth and life," Jesus assures his disciples. At that time they did not understand what he meant; they wanted easy answers. "Just show us the Father," Philip begged. But the first and second readings show us how the early church came to understand Jesus' words. The amazing growth of the church led them to select seven men to do the works of service needed with so many new members. The followers of Jesus had grown in such numbers that Peter could exclaim in his Letter over the fact that Christ, the "rejected stone," was now the cornerstone on whom the salvation of all the world rests. Don't forget to grab that bottle of water as you walk out the door to enjoy this beautiful weather that we are having. Drink water often; don't wait until you are thirsty! During hot weather, older individuals may unknowingly increase their risk by overdressing, refusing to use air conditioners or fans because of financial worries, or by remaining behind closed doors and windows out of concerns for personal safety. At the same time, seniors who lack easy access to transportation may be unable to travel to places that have air conditioning, such as senior centers or cooling centers set up by local public health officials. A lack of mobility can also be a risk factor for heat-related illness. An individual who has difficulty walking or getting up from a chair may not make the attempt to get something to drink, even when thirsty. **Check on elderly relatives and neighbors twice daily during hot weather!**

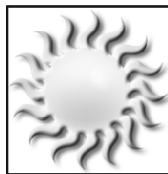
