SACRAMENTAL LIFE

Infant Baptism

Parents must be registered in the parish a minimum of 3 months prior to taking the baptismal preparation class. Contact the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Please contact the Parish Office if you are baptized in the Catholic Church and seeking confirmation as an adult, or are considering or desiring to become Catholic and are baptized in another Christian church or are not baptized and are 7 years of age or older.

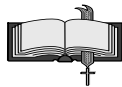

GLORIA **Pastor's Corner**

The Penitential Act helps us to acknowledge our sinfulness and celebrate God's never-ending mercy and love at the beginning of the Mass; then we sing the song of praise, the Gloria, with the angel's choir words from Luke 2:14, giving glory to the Trinity: the Father, Jesus, the Christ, and the Holy Spirit.

Beginning November 27th, the First Sunday of Advent, when we say the Gloria, we will use the new translation that follows, with the changes in bold print:

*"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, Almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, **Only Begotten Son**, Lord God, Lamb of God, **Son of the Father**, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; **you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer**; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, **have mercy on us**. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen."*

The most significant change is that Jesus is addressed as the "Only Begotten Son." This language more closely reflects the theological language used in the early Church. It highlights how Jesus is uniquely God's Son, sharing in the same divine nature as the Father, and it also reflects the biblical language in the Gospel of John. While each of us is called to a special relationship with God as His son or daughter through grace, Jesus alone is the eternal, divine Son by nature, the "only begotten Son" of the Father. (See John 1:12, 14, 18; 3:16, 18; 1 John 3:1).

Next week I will talk about The Liturgy of The Word as we continue with the order of Mass.
