#### THE EUCHARIST I

For the past weeks I have shared with you the first part of the Mass: Greetings. Penitential Rite. the Gloria, the Liturgy of the Word.

the Creed and Petitions. For the next few weeks, I want to share with you the second part of the Mass: the Liturgy of **Eucharist**.

Jesus chose the time of Passover to give His disciples His Body and Blood in the Eucharist. In Luke's Gospel we read that "when the day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread arrived, the day for sacrificing the Passover lamb, He sent out Peter and John, instructing them, 'Go and make preparations for us to eat the Passover." (Lk. 22:7-8). By celebrating the Last Supper with His Apostles in the course of the Passover meal, Jesus gave the Jewish Passover its definitive meaning. Indeed, at the Last Supper, Our Lord anticipated His own "passing over" to His Father by His death and Resurrection.

This "new Passover" of the Lord, which fulfills the Jewish Passover, is today celebrated in the Eucharist – the Mass. So, when we celebrate Mass, we remember the first Passover, when our Israelite ancestors were freed from slavery in Egypt; we commemorate Jesus' new Passover, by which we were redeemed from our own slavery to sin; and we look forward to the final Passover of the Church at the end of time, when Jesus will come again in glory, and when all the elect will be seated at the heavenly banquet in the kingdom of God.

Today, you and I celebrate the Eucharist because Jesus at the Last Supper commanded us, "Do this in memory of me" (Lk. 22:19c; 1 Cor. 11:24-25) until He comes again at the end of time. From the very beginning, the Church has been faithful to the Lord's command. We read in the Acts of the Apostles that "they devoted themselves to the Apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers . . . day by day attending the temple together and breaking bread in the homes" (Act. 2:42, 46a).

It was on "the first day of the week," Sunday, the day of Jesus' Resurrection, that the early Christians met "to break bread." From that time on, and down to our own day, the celebration of the Eucharist - the Mass - has been continued, so that today we encounter it everywhere in the Church with the same fundamental structure. The Mass remains the source and summit of the Church's life, and of our own. **The Mass: A.D. 33– present!**

#### **GOD REVEALED TO THE NATIONS**

What wonderful images we have today of the reign of God! Isaiah speaks to us of a great feast—a heavenly feast—a feast of abundance with rich foods and choice wines. It is the Lord's own affair, Isaiah explains, when God will unite all nations, dry every tear, and destroy death forever. Then, too, will the entire earth rejoice in the Lord and bask in God's saving grace.

Jesus speaks of heaven in terms of a feast as well. Here, the kingdom of heaven is likened to a king's wedding feast given for his son. This is a feast of abundance also, with the fattened cattle prepared just so. But many of the people invited don't want to come, so the king invites anyone who would honor his son by their presence there. And Paul tells us that whether we live abundantly or in humble circumstances, we can do all things in the Lord who strengthens us.
