Infant Baptism

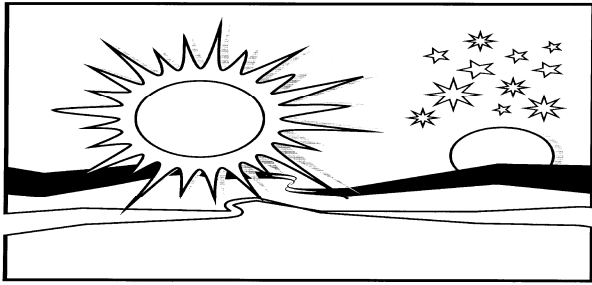

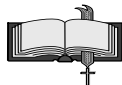

THE EUCHARIST II

From the time of the Apostles, very shortly after Our Lord’s Passion, Death and Resurrection, Catholics have celebrated the Eucharist in a way that has not changed substantially for nearly 2,000 years. Why has the Mass survived intact through the centuries? Why has its substance not changed despite the vast changes in society and culture that have occurred? It is because we know ourselves to be bound by the command that Jesus gave us at the very first Mass—The Last Supper—on the eve of his Passion: **“Do this in memory of me”** (Lk. 22:19c; 1 Cor. 11:24-25).

We carry out His command by celebrating the memorial of His sacrifice. In so doing, we offer to the Father what He himself has given us: the gifts of His creation—bread and wine—which, by the power of the Holy Spirit and by the words of Christ, have become the Body and Blood of Christ. Jesus is thus really and mysteriously present in the Mass. We therefore consider the sacramental sacrifice of the Eucharist to be: (1) **thanksgiving and praise to God the Father**; (2) the **sacrificial memorial of Christ the Son** and his very Body and Blood; (3) **the presence of Christ** by the power of His word and of His *Holy Spirit* in the Church.

As we, the Church, celebrate the Eucharist (Eucharist means “thanksgiving”), we offer, through Christ, the perfect sacrifice of praise in thanksgiving for all that God has created and has made good, beautiful and just. We recognize that what we do is made possible only through Christ, because, through Christ, we have become adopted daughters and sons of God. It is Jesus who unites us to his person, to his praise, and to his intercession as the priest elevates the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ toward heaven and proclaims: **“Through Him, with Him, in Him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, Almighty Father, forever and ever.”** We joyfully join all of the choirs of Angels and all of the Saints in heaven and respond **“Amen”** which means “Yes! we believe and so be it.”

We are gathered together at the table for the Eucharist every day, and we continue to gather beyond the Eucharistic table as St. Frances Cabrini Family. I want to express my profound gratitude to **ALL** who participated in the 55th Annual Fiesta last weekend: different parish groups and committees, Benefactors, Sponsors, Volunteers, Participants, the Assyrian Catholics, and Dave and Pam Citrigno (Fiesta Chairman and Vice-Chairwoman). We cannot form a unique and wonderful St. Frances Cabrini Family without **YOU**. Thank You!

May God bless you and your family for your continued support to St. Frances Cabrini Parish **WHERE CHRIST EMBRACES ALL.**

FEAST OF FAITH

Only Say the Word

The bread is broken, the banquet is prepared, and now we are invited to the feast. Once more the priest holds the host, now broken, for us to see, and invites us to behold the one "who takes away the sins of the world." Truly blessed and happy are those invited to this meal, which is a foretaste of the heavenly banquet, the supper of the Lamb (Revelation 19:19). We respond to this invitation with a prayer to the Lord: we acknowledge that we are not worthy, but at the same time we are confident that the One who comes to us can heal us, body and soul. This prayer echoes the story of the centurion in Luke's Gospel. The centurion, a Gentile, asks healing for his servant, but does not consider himself worthy to have Jesus come under his roof—he believes that Jesus can heal his servant with a word, without even seeing him. Jesus is amazed at his faith. It is the same for us. We believe that Jesus speaks to us, comes to us, dwells with us, even though we neither hear his voice nor see his face.
