



## SACRAMENTAL LIFE

### Infant Baptism

Parents must be registered in the parish a minimum of 3 months prior to taking the baptismal preparation class. Contact the Parish Office.

### Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Please contact the Parish Office if you are baptized in the Catholic Church and seeking confirmation as an adult, or are considering or desiring to become Catholic and are baptized in another Christian church or are not baptized and are 7 years of age or older.

### Marriage

Couples must contact the Priest they wish to witness the Sacrament at least 6 months prior to the proposed date of marriage. Contact the Parish Office.

### Sacraments to the Sick and Homebound





### HOPE AND LIFE

Today's readings tell the story of two widows. The first reading relates the plight of the widow with whom the prophet Elijah stayed; the Gospel tells about the widow of Nain. In each story, the widow's only son had died. For people who lived in those cultures, the son was the only support of a widow, and the carrying on of the family name by the son was equal to immortality. A widow whose only son has died could lose all hope.

Elijah and Jesus are the restorers of hope; they bring the sons back to life. Saint Paul was metaphorically raised from the dead when he experienced the conversion and call from God that he describes in today's second reading.

What are Christians called to do today? We may not be able to raise the dead, but perhaps we can rekindle hope for a single parent. We may not be able to convert a persecutor like Paul, but if we speak the gospel openly and gently with our lives,

### LIBRARY NEWS


#### The greater the knowledge the stronger the love.

### Blessed Pope John XXIII.



On June 3, 2013, the Church remembers the 50th anniversary of the death of Blessed Pope John XXIII. His papacy did much to bring the Church into the modern age, encouraging her to evangelize the nations not by withdrawing from the world but by engaging with it and showing it the joyful, hopeful, pastoral face of Christ.

The Church customarily assigns feast days for its holy men and women by the date of their death. However, because of the significance of Vatican II and its association with Blessed John XXIII, the Church assigned the date of the Council's opening, October 11, as the date of his feast.

Yet, in this Year of Faith, we remember "Good Pope John" in a special way at his anniversary. With abiding faith in the working of the Spirit today and continued trust in a renewed vision of the Church brought forth by Blessed John XXIII, **Bishop Patrick J. McGrath invites all parishes and worshiping communities to mark the 50th anniversary Pope John XXIII's death with reflection, prayer, and intercession.**

### Prayer at the opening sessions of Vatican II:

We stand before you, Holy Spirit, conscious of our sinfulness, but aware that we gather in your name.

Come to us, remain with us, and enlighten our hearts.

Give us light and strength to know your will, to make it our own, and to live it in our lives.

Guide us by your wisdom, support us by your power, for you are God sharing the glory of Father and Son.

You desire justice for all: enable us to uphold the rights of others; do not allow us to be misled by ignorance or corrupted by fear or favor.

Unite us to yourself in the bond of love and keep us faithful to all that is true.

As we gather in your name may we temper justice with love, so that all our decisions may be pleasing to you and earn the reward promised to good and faithful servants. You live and reign with the Father and the Son, One God, forever and ever. Amen.
