Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

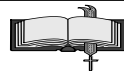

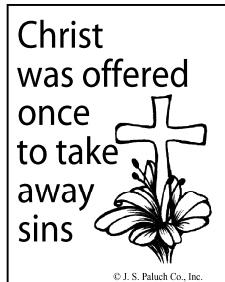
